Past Activities

19 JUNE—SOCIAL NIGHT—OPAL VIDEO, Part 2

Opal is a beautiful stone but nothing will entice me to go down a mine digging for them. For me the only opal fossicking is by using the wallet fossicking method - for me, safer, cleaner and largely cheaper.

17 JULY—SOCIAL NIGHT, Talk by ANN KENNON, "HISTORY OF MINERAL COLLECTING".

Ann covered the period in Europe, and eventually the US, from the late 15th through to the 19th century. It is hard to image now that some 500 years ago only 20 types of mineral (today we know of over 5000) were considered to exist. No wonder the famous l'uby'from the Black Prince's jewels has subsequently been found to be a spinel. It was not until quite late in the 500 year timescale were things like hardness and crystals shapes etc, finally considered and defined. Even the cleavage of crystals was discovered by accident when one collector dropped his prized specimen on the floor. Perhaps unfortunately, many of the original collections have been dispersed, or otherwise lost, over the years.

Ann showed images of wood cut pictures of some of these old collections. These images showed original collections being a mix of mineral specimens in among wildly diverse curiosities. Without the benefit of photography the original collectors had to draw or paint their specimens with amazing accuracy.

Mineral Group Meeting

Fourteen members present, including three new members. Ann reported on her and Noel's visit to the mine at Cornwall detailing the minerals to be found. In her talk during the Social Night, Ann, also, mentioned the museum being very well worth a visit. Peter presented the identification exercise and the minerals were; garnet, prehnite, quartz x3, nephrite, malachite and fluorite. Mary presented gypsum as the Mineral of the Month. Gypsum (CaSO4-2(H2O), hydrated calcium sulphate) is one of the more common minerals in sedimentary environments. It is a major rock forming mineral that produces massive beds usually from

common minerals in sedimentary environments. It is a major rock forming mineral that produces massive beds, usually from precipitation out of highly saline waters. Since it forms easily from saline water, gypsum can have many inclusions of other minerals and even trapped bubbles of air and water. Your fingernail will scratch this clear, white to gold or brown mineral ---- that's the simplest way to identify gypsum.

Noel discussed crystal structures as the Topic of the Month. Noel explained how all minerals fall into one of the seven crystal systems which are; cubic, tetragonal, orthorhombic, hexagonal, rhombohedral, monoclinic and triclinic.

Exercise for next month—imagine your mineral collection is lost and you were offered ten different minerals to start a new collection. List from one to ten what minerals you would select.
