Any member of the Illawarra Lapidary Club Inc can enter the competition! Why enter the competition? Because it's fun, it's nice to get recognition for something and even if you don't win, you'll receive feedback about your entry that can help you improve in the future.

Keeping an eye on the prize is motivating, whether you win or not, the experience is still rewarding!

The Show competition will be judged according to the **Competitor & Judging Manual for Lapidary and Allied Competitions Issue no. 8 April 2015 and updates as of 2022**. It's a blue book which can be found at the clubhouse, hanging in the cutting room. Please read through it if you are entering, to familiarise yourself with the requirements.

Entrants must be current, financial members of the Illawarra Lapidary Club Inc.

All entries must be accompanied by the competition entry form (which can be found in this document on pages 3 and 4) and must be received by the Illawarra Lapidary Club by the 20th of September 2023. Please ensure that you enter the correct section and label it as such. Only sections listed below can be entered for the Illawarra Lapidary Club Inc's Annual Exhibition. Judging of the entries will be held in October on a date to be specified. All entries should be directed in person to the clubhouse, 51 Meadow St, Tarrawanna. Please hand your entries to Eva, Joan or a Committee member, do not leave your items unattended at the clubhouse for someone to collect.

Postal entries will not be accepted.

The maximum number of entries in each section are as follows: Two entries per person, per section.

Completed judging sheets and entries will be available approximately two weeks after the exhibition for collection from Joan.

Please note that personal maker's marks/branding of the entrant etc are not to be put on entries to be judged for the competition.

All entries are to be submitted in their own individual bag. Mark each bag with the Section entered and a short description of the item only. **Do not** put your name on the bag.

For multiple entries, all must be individually bagged and then can be placed into one bag.

If you have trouble filling out the form, please consult with Eva, Joan, your supervisor or one of the Committee Members.

All faceting entries must be accompanied by the faceting design/diagram followed, regardless of them being set out in this document. Cabochon

Dichroic Glass

Please ensure if wire wrapping your piece, that there are no visible gaps, it does not catch on anything and that there are no sharp edges. Dichroic pieces are not required to be polished on the back. Dichroic glass entries fall under Section 45 and 46. Please refer to the Competitor & Judging Manual for Lapidary and Allied Competitions Issue no. 8 April 2015 and updates as of 2022 for entry conditions.

Entries for this section will not be judged by a G&L Judge as it is non-lapidary. Please refer to Section 47 for entry description.



Cut 3 at 96-48 these will meet half way.

Cut 5 this will give a third for all facets (this facet does not take much cutting)

Please note, the backs of stones need to be polished and have a back bevel to be entered into the competition as per the above-mentioned manual.




